

ORDINANCE NO. 2018 – 20

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING FUNDS IN THE
ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT INCOME TAX FUND

WHEREAS, the City of Greenfield in Section 30.19 of the Code of Ordinances created an Economic Development Income Tax Fund;

WHEREAS, the utilization of funds received in the Economic Development Income Tax fund may be used for any purpose set forth in said Section 30.19; and

WHEREAS, funds are needed to pay the necessary expenses toward vehicle replacement fund requests from the following non-profit organizations:

- Hancock County Veteran’s Honor Guard in the amount of \$5,000.00
- Hancock County Senior Services in the amount of \$5,000.00

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GREENFIELD, INDIANA:

SECTION I.

The Common Council of the City of Greenfield hereby appropriates the following expenditures for the expenses of purchasing a new vehicle which will help to service the citizens of the City of Greenfield and Hancock County.

The total amount of \$10,000.00 will be taken from the Economic Development Income Tax Fund:

EDIT FUND 224100500.000 and paid to the following:

- Hancock County Veteran’s Honor Guard in the amount of \$5,000.00
- Hancock County Senior Services in the amount of \$5,000.00

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.
